

# Train-the-Trainer, Learn how to conduct an Outfall Safari

The Outfall Safari is a citizen science method for surveying outfalls in urban rivers and reporting those that are polluted to the relevant authorities for follow up. It engages communities in the issue of misconnections and the problem facing urban rivers. This workshop is for NGOs, Water Companies and EA staff wishing to lead or support outfall surveys.
